We are going to set the list of FTOs at the end of January for the entire calendar year. The list will be updated again next January.

We are moving forward with ordering parts to add dual oxygen to ambulances. Two ambulances per month until they are all done.

Please complete the survey to share your opinion on what the priorities should be for capital budget requests.

We are trialing an iPad in the front of an ambulance to be used for *TangoTango*, *Freedom*, and a second device to do EHR reports on.

We are watching intelligence reports for possible violence next week and will adjust transfer patterns if we need to.

Managers are working on hiring more PRN staff now that all full time are filled.
