Clarification from Dr. Nicholes on COVID treatments: Protocol is still accurate (https://www.emsprotocols.online/cmhems/2-330.php) with the following order of preference of treatments for new COVID infections with severe respiratory distress:

- 1. Oxygen NRB.
- 2. Use the patient's prescribed MDI.
- 3. Epi IM.
- 4. Only if none of the above are available or work, consider nebulizer. Do NOT administer steroids.
- 5. Only if none of the above are available or work, consider intubation.
- 6. Do NOT provide CPAP or BiPAP.

If you do not suspect COVID, steroids, nebulizer, intubation, CPAP, BiPAP, etc. are still all OK as long as the crew is wearing N95
